2025 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



Over the past year, I have carried out over **100 constituency visits and meetings**. This has included visits to schools, meetings with Tenants and Residents' Associations, community walkabouts, supermarket surgeries and conversations with local organisations and businesses to make sure constituents' voices are heard and acted on.

What I have heard during these visits has directly shaped my work in Parliament and the constituency. Residents and organisations have told us about the issues that matter most in their day to day lives and we have focused our efforts on delivering where it is needed most.



SPOTLIGHTING MY PRIORITIES



My priorities are shaped by what I hear from you. Here are some of the issues I focused on this year.

HOUSING - IMPROVING HOUSING CONDITIONS & THE AYLESBURY ESTATE

I know that the availability and condition of housing is a key concern for people across Peckham. This Government is committed to fixing the housing crisis, including through record investment in affordable housing, a new Renters Rights Bill and Awaab's Law to protect tenants from poor quality homes. I have also been acting locally to improve housing across the Borough. I have spoken out against developments that do not meet the requirements of our community, held a housing repair summit and held regular meetings with TRAs to support them with improving their local area.

A particular focus for me has been supporting residents on the Aylesbury Estate, where I have been working with Southwark Council and the Police to drive action on repairs, safety and upkeep on the Estate. This has included securing an Aylesbury Taskforce, pressing for faster repairs and quicker turnaround of empty homes and calling for increased community patrols and more regular engagement with residents.

SPOTLIGHTING MY PRIORITIES



BUILDING BETTER YOUTH FUTURES IN PECKHAM

Listening to young people and youth workers, we have been championing stronger youth services across Peckham throughout the year.

This summer I visited the Damilola Taylor Youth Centre with Janet Daby MP, Minister for Children and Families, and Lib Peck, Director of the Violence Reduction Unit. We met young people and community partners delivering the MyEnds programme. I also had sixth formers from St Thomas the Apostle College and members of the Southwark Youth Parliament join me in Parliament to share their ideas and ambitions.

Most recently, in December, I joined the Co-operative Party's Community Britain Campaign to bring together youth leaders from across Peckham to discuss how we can work together to secure more support for youth services locally. I heard the same message again and again: young people want to lead, and they want spaces that reflect who they are. We will continue to work with them on this campaign to make that happen.

GOVERNMENT ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2025

The biggest upgrade to Workers Rights in a generation.

Greater security for 11 million private renters, including banning no fault evictions

550,000 children lifted out of poverty

The introduction of a landmark £5 million Pride in Place programme to give power to people across the UK to restore Pride in their Place.

Once in a generation £29 billion investment into social and affordable housing, to fix the housing crisis

A budget to tackle the cost of living with a pay rise for 3 million workers, rail fare freezes, £150 off energy bills for all households and a further £150 off bills for 6 million more and freezing prescription charges

30 hours of fully funded breakfast clubs a week
